Further Hallberg-Rassy victories in the Atlantic Rally for Cruisers

The German Hallberg-Rassy 54 "Bluewater Mooney" is the winner of the ARC 2015, class D. She is the fastest boat in the category, both on actual time and

on corrected time. This is the third time a Hallberg-Rassy 54 wins her category in the ARC.

As if this wouldn't be enough, there are another two Hallberg-Rassys winning 3rd place in their category; the 48 "Alpaire" in category F, and the 42F "Cavatina" in category G. Also, in the ARC Plus, another Hallberg-Rassy 54, "Anorak" won her category.

This proves that a comfortable long distance cruiser doesn't need to lack in performance.

The skipper of Irish Halberg-Rassy 48 "Alpaire" reports: We, Alpaire, were first Hallberg-Rassy in the ARC 2015 and 7th Overall, beating Blue Water Mooney and all other Hallberg-Rassys overall. We broke nothing and all systems functioned perfectly. The two spinnaker poles with two identical jibs on the same roller was a dream to sail with. We also used some heavy duty routing software for weather routing and stayed in the breeze. I expected to motor, so we carried 1200 kgs diesel but we never did and we carried 1200 kgs of Water as well in addition to the water maker and the RIB and engine on the stern. With the full main, we never dropped below 7.5 knots. And finally I won First Overall prize for Skipper in the 60+ division.

Congratulations to the successful crews of "Alpaire", "Bluewater Mooney" "Anorak" and "Cavatina"!






Lifetime Achievement Award to Germán Frers


Hallberg-Rassy's designer Germán Frers from Argentina, has received a"**Lifetime Achievement Award**" by the British magazine Sailing Today.

The 29th of April 2016, Per Andersson was getting retired after 44 years as an employee for Hallberg-Rassy. Per started his career in the past Rassy's Båtbyggeri in Kungsviken 1972.

At first, he built the Misil II, a yellow 24 footer. Per remembers when some of the boats had a heater in the shape of a fireplace that was built into a sheet metal socket in the main bulkhead, equipped with a chimney that reached up to deck. It was heated with wood and cones. In the beginning, the Misil had no engine at all, but later an outboard motor was used. In the end production of the Misil, finally an inboard engine also became an option.

In 1973, there was a live broadcast from the yard by the Swedish Radio program "Skivor till kaffet" by Sven-Bertil Perrolf, a famous radio voice in Sweden. That was a really big happening!

In the beginning of his loyal career, Per got a salary of SEK 15 (around 1.60 Euro) pro hour. Over the years, Per has been working as both a carpenter and a varnisher, and he has also been laying the beautiful teak on deck. Per has got on well with his work through all the years.

The Hallberg-Rassy 44 will be completely finished December 2016 and world premiere is at the world's largest boat show, Boot Düsseldorf 21-29 January 2017. You may order a 44 now. You get a fixed price and a fixed delivery time. Hallberg-Rassy has always delivered on time, a promise held on over 9,200 boats delivered.

Integral bowsprit

There is an integral bowsprit that serves many different purposes:

- It is an ideal and efficient tack point for a code zero, or gennaker
- It is ideal for carrying an anchor for the electric windlass

• It is ideal for a bow ladder, making it easy to get onboard from a low dock or in a natural harbour

Twin rudders

The twin rudders configuration gives a modern hull form ultimate control in all conditions, on all points of sail and the reduced load on each rudder increases the security of the system. The mechanical advantage of a single big wheel gives the helmsman control and feedback under sail, especially in tough weather.

Hidden control lines in the cockpit

There is a winch on the starboard coaming in the cockpit. Ropes from the mast aft to the clutches are hidden neatly. Excess lines aft of the clutches, stow in a storage box that is neatly hidden in the coaming. If you have electric in-mast furling, you can control outhaul, vang, main halyard and code zero halyard from the cockpit.

Large cockpit

As tradition says, the cockpit of a Hallberg-Rassy is very well sheltered. The cockpit length is a generous 2.29 m, no less than 19 cm longer than on the 43 Mk III. The pedestal head has space for a good size modern chart plotter with multi function display.

Fold out bathing platform

There is a large fold out bathing platform. As standard the platform folds out manually, optionally there is a push button operation available. When the platform is not in use, the transom is elegantly closed.

Modern sailplan

The sailplan is modern. There is no need for any runners even with an optional cutter stay, either fixed with furler or detachable. The headsail is only slightly overlapping, making tacking easy. There is even a selftacking option. The jib furler is a Furlex TD with under deck drum. The deck layout is clean and uncluttered with under deck mounted electric windlass and

all deck hatches are flush mounted.

The waterline is 12.88 m, which is no less than 1.13 m longer than on the 43 Mk III. Frers speed prediction table tells that a loaded Hallberg-Rassy 44 will make 8.49 knots boat speed at 100 degrees in just 12 knots of true wind.

Linear or u shaped galley

There is a choice of the standard U shaped galley to starboard or the optional linear galley to port with large work top space on both sides of the galley. There are also options for freezer, microwave, extractor fan with charcoal filter and even room for a dish washer.

One or two cabins forward of the mast

There are three options for the layout in front of the mast. One with a one cabin and two with a two cabin configuration.

The standard layout has a large v cabin and a very large head with a separate shower with plexi glass doors and space for a washing machine. There is lots of

locker space, two hanging lockers and a seat.

There are two layout options with an extra cabin: One with the large heads and an extra twin bunks cabin to starboard, as well as the standard v cabin.

Another available option is to have a separate passage to the v cabin and still a two bunks cabin to starboard. The forward heads in this version is not as large as the first two layouts mentioned.


Generous aft cabin

The aft cabin is generous for the size of boat and available in two versions; two individual berths with a wide sofa between, or an extra wide, comfortable centre line berth, with dressing table to starboard and a rounded seat to port.

The aft heads is generous with a separate shower and plexi glass doors. There is an opening portlight towards the cockpit.

Lots of natural light

The floor is in one level throughout the boat. There are six flush mounted deck hatches and eight opening portlights, as well as four hull portlights. The hull portlights are larger than those of other Hallberg-Rassys of this size. They are now as large as those on the flagship Hallberg-Rassy 64. All portlights and deck hatches have clear glass, except in the heads, which is milk coloured, to allow light in but obscure view into this compartment. The Hallberg-Rassy 44 has lots of natural light and good ventilation throughout the interior.

Along the way you'll meet Hina, queen of a remote island paradise who will instantly invite you to a lobster feast on a moonlit beach under rustling coconut palms. Discover the hidden treasure of a tiny fair isle when a ripped sail forces them ashore for repairs.

Not to be missed are countless other tales of adventure including their first date, sailing from Cape Horn to Antarctica and their insights on keeping a relationship on an even keel.

John Neal was born on the banks of Africa's Blue Nile River. At the age of 22 his love of adventure and travel fueled a desire to sail to the South Pacific from Seattle aboard his 27' Albin Vega sloop. To answer the frequently-asked question, "How can I find and prepare a boat for ocean voyaging?" he conducted the first of now 156 Offshore Cruising Seminars in 1976. In 1990, to meet the requests for hands-on offshore instruction, John established Mahina Expeditions with the goal of sharing his knowledge of ocean voyaging in a safe and supportive environment. John has conducted 171 sail-training expeditions aboard his Hallberg-Rassy Monsun 31 "Mahina Tiare", Hallberg-Rassy 42E, "Mahina Tiare III", and Hallberg-Rassy 46, "Mahina Tiare III", sailing 342,000 miles in the South Pacific, Caribbean, Patagonia, Antarctica, Atlantic, Scandinavia and the Arctic.

Amanda Swan Neal grew up in Auckland,

New Zealand and sailed to Tonga, Tahiti, Hawaii and Vancouver as a teenager aboard a 38' sloop she helped her parents build. Upon returning to New Zealand, she worked as a sailmaker and as a rigger. In 1990 she completed The Whitbread Around the World Race (now The Volvo Ocean Race) as rigger aboard Maiden, the first all-women Whitbread boat. Amanda's 300,000 miles of ocean sailing include two Sydney-Hobart Races, numerous international regattas and seven Cape Horn roundings. Since joining John in 1994 for Mahina Tiare's Cape Horn and Antarctic expeditions, Amanda has co-skippered aboard Mahina Tiare. Amanda enjoys introducing women to the joys of the cruising lifestyle.

Amanda and John spend 6 - 7 months at sea sailing 10,000 miles annually while conducting sail-training expeditions aboard their Hallberg-Rassy 46, Mahina Tiare III. Their website is: www.mahina.com


